NEW IN 2021

NEW SHERATON FALLSVIEW - COMING JUNE 21

COMING UP SPRING 2021

AN INTERNATIONAL FOUR-SEASON BIRDWATCHING DESTINATION

With its proximity to the Niagara River corridor, one of the world's most biodiverse places, Niagara Falls is an untapped four-season international destination for bird lovers, adventure travelers and ecotourists alike. More than 280 bird species can be found in the Niagara River Corridor. Over 27 species of gulls, many of them rare, have been found here making it the best gull watching location in the world and a top destination for birders from all over the world hoping to add them to their list. In 1996, the entire Niagara River corridor, stretching 56 km from Lake Erie to Lake Ontario, became the first site in North America to receive international recognition as an **Important Bird and Biodiversity Area (IBA)** by major conservation groups in Canada and the United States. The IBA program aims to identify, monitor, and protect the world's most important sites for birds.

Numbers from eBird show that birdwatching, already considered the fastest growing recreational activity prior to the pandemic, has increased 30% from March 2020 to March 2021. According to eBird 170 species can be sighted at Dufferin Islands alone in Niagara Falls.

Niagara Falls is surrounded by some of the most spectacular gardens that are ranked among the most beautiful public gardens in Canada and around the world. The gardens and landscaped spaces are open year around and the flowers vary each season offering a backdrop of thousands of changing blooms. Niagara Falls is the Daffodil Capital of North America and also boasts an impressive tulip display, Canada's largest rose garden, a Magnolia Allee, the fragrant Centennial Lilac Garden, the iconic Floral Clock (16,000+ plants), one of Canada's largest Botanical gardens, plus a serene Japanese-style garden that is often referred to as the Secret Garden! WORLD BICYCLE DAY (June 3, 2021)

Celebrate World Bicycle Day in Niagara Falls, one of Ontario's premier cycling destinations with over 300km of exceptional cycling routes and trails for beginners and pros alike. Whether you rent a bike or bring your own, there are great trails, bike friendly restaurants and self-guided tours to suit every level of cyclist in Niagara Falls Canada. Begin a cycling tour in the Falls and travel along the **Niagara River Recreation Trail**, which offers over 56



kilometers of breathtaking views, including the Niagara Glen and Whirlpool, finishing in historic Niagara-on-the-Lake. Cycle through the <u>Greater Niagara Circle Route</u>, a 140 km picturesque route along the Niagara Parkway beside Niagara Falls leading you through the lush greenery of the Niagara Escarpment. <u>Niagara River Bike Tours</u> offer two- and half-hour cycling tours showcase the hidden gems along the Niagara River.

13,000 YEARS OF INDIGENOUS SETTLEMENT IN THE NIAGARA REGION

Niagara Parks Speaker Series: Dr. Rob Macdonald and Dr. Martin Cooper

Archaeological evidence suggests that as the Laurentide Ice Sheet receded 13,000 years ago, Indigenous peoples adapted to a new landscape in the Great Lakes area. The location of their settlements and the technology they created demonstrate a transition that evolved for thousands of years. In this seminar, discover how Indigenous peoples responded to drastic landscape changes in the Niagara region, and shifted from a hunter-gatherer economy to an agricultural economy over the course of 2000 years.

BIRD KINGDOM (Virtual)

Bird Kingdom is bringing the wonder of birds to you! Their Virtual Field Trip is a mix of live animal interaction and prerecorded footage of the animals at Bird Kingdom, showing the most amazing and educational experiences you can see at the world's largest indoor free-flying aviary. Each class runs 35 minutes and costs \$95 for up to 50 participants. Their presentation involves audience interaction, so be ready to type your answers and ask questions during the live presentation. Learn something new about birds and why we should care about protecting the natural environment. It may be hard or impossible for groups to travel, but Bird Kingdom is bringing education and inspiration direct to your screen. During lockdown classes can be booked 7 days a week from 9am to 4pm.

NIAGARA'S INDIGENOUS LEGACY (Virtual)

The Niagara Region was a place of awe and wonder for the Indigenous peoples who first walked this land. Their ancestors' footsteps arrived approximately 13,000 years ago as the melting glaciers retreated northward, revealing the Great Lakes of Erie and Ontario and the mighty Niagara River. Explore the collection featuring objects that reveal the presence of Indigenous peoples, their art and history in the Niagara region, extending back hundreds of generations up to the present day. Explore videos created by curators Rob MacDonald, Rick Hill and Dave Labbe as they explain the source materials, uses and beauty of the Indigenous artifacts in the collections.
